Class Interview with Lily	<ul> <li>In this conversation, you and Lily will interview each other for a class project.</li> <li>You will: <ul> <li>Practice speaking to someone on the phone.</li> <li>Ask questions, including questions about how someone is.</li> <li>Discuss family and hobbies.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Students can:</li> <li>Provide basic, prepared information on the phone. For example: their name, address, telephone number, and their request.</li> <li>Ask how people are.</li> <li>Give personal information (address, telephone number, nationality, age, family and hobbies).</li> </ul>
Helping Owen with a Recipe	<ul> <li>In this conversation, Owen needs your help to make food.</li> <li>You will: <ul> <li>Ask how someone is.</li> <li>Describe ingredients.</li> <li>Say you like or don't like something.</li> <li>Use numbers in simple conversations.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Students can:</li> <li>Ask how people are.</li> <li>Describe what they can do and can't do and what other people or animals can or can't do.</li> <li>Describe what they like and don't like.</li> <li>Use and understand simple numbers in everyday conversations.</li> </ul>
